

**AUTHORIZING JURISDICTIONAL TRANSFER OF A SEGMENT OF ANNIE GLIDDEN ROAD FROM DEKALB COUNTY, ILLINOIS TO THE CITY OF DEKALB, ILLINOIS.**

**WHEREAS**, the City of DeKalb (the "City") is a home rule unit of local government and may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs pursuant to Article VII, Section 6, of the Illinois Constitution of 1970; and

**WHEREAS**, the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 5 ILCS 220/1, *et seq.*, authorizes cooperative agreements between the State of Illinois and Illinois units of local government; and

**WHEREAS**, the City and DeKalb County (the "County") agreed to transfer the County's jurisdiction of Annie Glidden Road from the south edge of pavement of Dresser Road to the north right of way line of County Health Boulevard, a distance of 0.240 miles, to the City pursuant to the terms of the Jurisdictional Transfer Agreement attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit A (the "Agreement"); and

**WHEREAS**, the City's corporate authorities find that approving the Agreement is in the City's best interests for the protection of the public health, safety, and welfare; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DEKALB, ILLINOIS:**

**SECTION 1:** The recitals to this resolution are adopted and incorporated herein as Section One to this Resolution.

**SECTION 2:** The City's corporate authorities approve, authorize, and direct the Mayor to execute the Agreement attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit A.

**SECTION 3:** The City's corporate authorities adopt, approve, and accept the jurisdictional transfer of approximately 1,265 feet (0,240 miles) of Annie Glidden Road from the south edge of pavement of Dresser Road to the north right of way line of County Health Boulevard, as more fully described in Addendum 1 to the Agreement, into the City's street system.

**SECTION 4:** This resolution and each of its terms shall be the effective legislative act of a home rule municipality without regard to whether such resolution should (a) contain terms contrary to the provision of current or subsequent non-preemptive state law, or (b) legislate in a manner or regarding a matter not delegated to municipalities by state law. It is the City's corporate authorities' intent that to the extent that the terms of this resolution should be inconsistent with any non-preemptive state law, this resolution shall supersede state law in that regard within its jurisdiction.

**SECTION 5:** This resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval as provided by law.



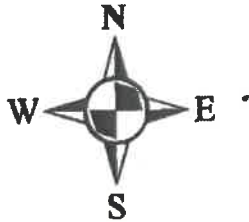

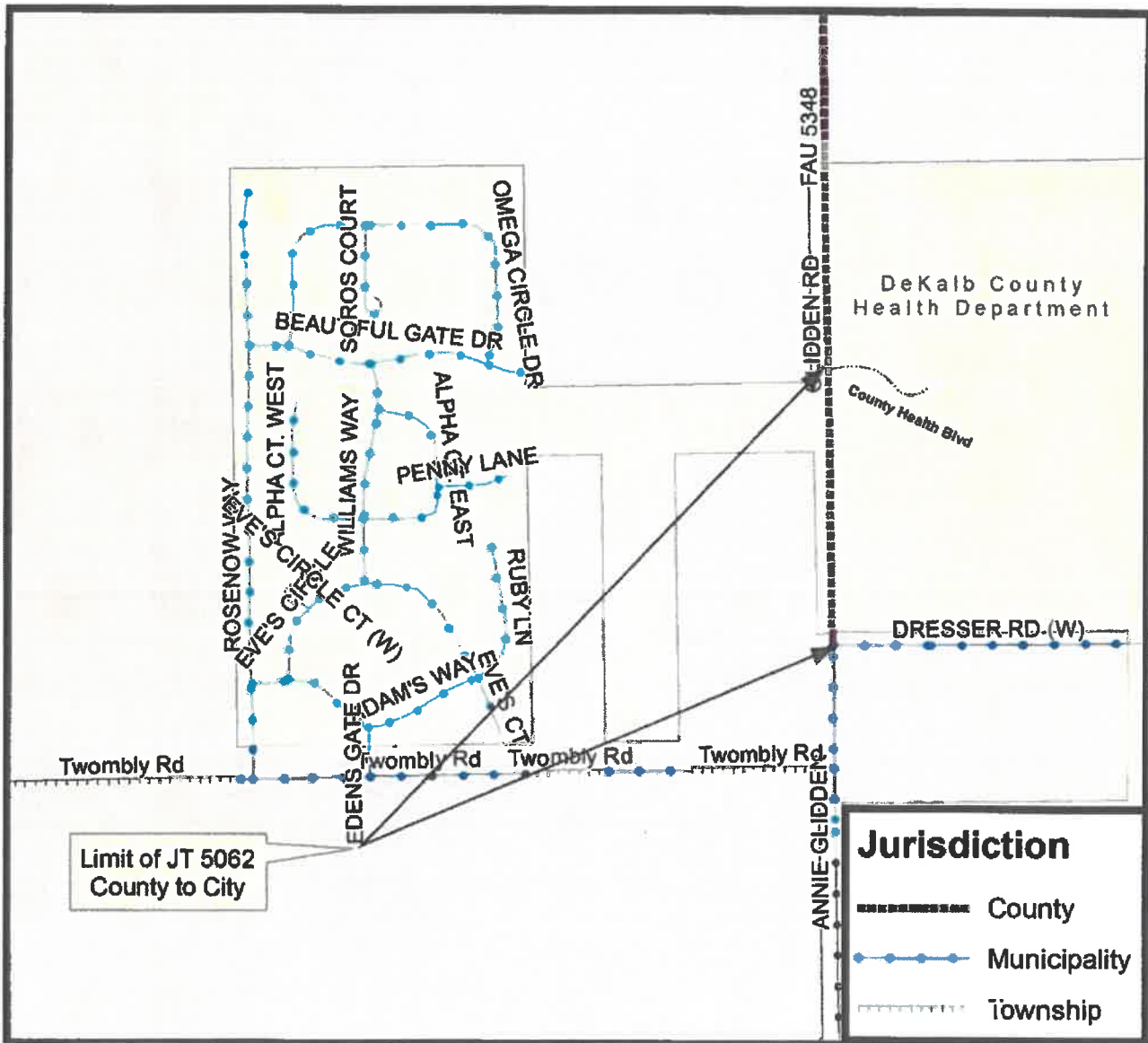

**RESOLUTION #R2022-189**

**WHEREAS**, the County of DeKalb, acting through its County Board, and the City of DeKalb, acting through its City Council, have mutually determined that it is in the interest of each party to transfer jurisdiction of Annie Glidden Road from the south edge of pavement of Dresser Road to the north right of way line of County Health Boulevard, a distance of 0.240 miles; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of DeKalb has agreed to assume jurisdiction of said described highway; and

**WHEREAS**, the said City has agreed to execute an agreement with the said County to transfer the jurisdiction of the said road from the County to the City.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, by the DeKalb County Board that approximately 1,265 feet (0.240 miles) of Annie Glidden Road from the south edge of pavement of Dresser Road to the north right of way line of County Health Boulevard be permanently removed from the County Highway System; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the County Clerk is hereby directed to transmit four certified copies of this resolution to the Illinois Department of Transportation, through its District Engineer's Office in Ottawa, Illinois.
