

ORDINANCE 12-30 Passed: April 23, 2012

**FIXING THE SALARY AND COMPENSATION
OF THE ELECTED CITY CLERK OF THE
CITY OF DEKALB, ILLINOIS AT \$5,000 PER
YEAR COMMENCING MAY 2013, AND
THEREAFTER.**

WHEREAS, Ordinance 08-75 provided for salary and compensation of the City Clerk as follows:

Commencing in May 2009, the City Clerk of the City of DeKalb, Illinois shall receive the sum of \$57,500.00 per annum, payable in equal biweekly installments with reimbursement for actual mileage used for City business at the reimbursement rate established by the Internal Revenue Service. Commencing in May 2010 and continuing each May thereafter, the salary sum shall be increased by three (3%). A City Clerk who elects to be covered by the City's hospital and medical plan on either a single, single plus one (1) dependent or single plus multi-dependent (family) basis, shall pay 15% of the current established premium. Commencing July 1, 2010 and thereafter the City Clerk shall pay 20% of the current premium as determined each July 1st. A City Clerk who elects to be covered shall receive the same insurance benefits provided to City employees covered by Chapter 3 of the DeKalb Municipal Code. Medical, hospitalization, dental and life insurance benefits are as set forth in approved plan handbooks and are subject to change by action of the City Council.

and,

WHEREAS, Section 3.14(k), "City Clerk" of Chapter 3, "City Administration," of the Municipal Code states that the salary for the City Clerk shall be reviewed at the last regularly scheduled meeting in June preceding a general municipal election; and,

WHEREAS, the compensation of elected officials shall be fixed at least 180 days before the beginning of the terms as cited in 50 ILCS 140/2; now,

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL of the City of DeKalb, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1. For and during the term of office commencing in May 2013, the elected City Clerk of the City of DeKalb, Illinois shall receive the sum of \$5,000 per annum, payable in equal biweekly installments with reimbursement for actual mileage used for City business at the reimbursement rate established by the Internal Revenue Service.

Section 2. That each section, paragraph, sentence, clause and provision of this ordinance is separable and if any provision is held unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the remainder of this ordinance, nor any part thereof, other than that part affected by such decision.

Section 3. That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and approval according to law.
