A NOTE TO LANDLORDS:


Over the last two years, you, as landlords, and the Crime Free Housing Bureau have collaboratively worked together which has resulted in a decrease in Crime-Free nuisance notifications being issued due to unlawful activity being committed on rental properties. In 2023, there were 98 nuisance notifications issued by November 1st, and in 2024, there were 43 notifications as of November 1st.

A NOTE TO LANDLORDS CONTINUED:

This is a decrease of 56% and is due mainly because of the shared responsibility and communication between all parties involved.

As responsible landlords, you guys have made a big difference.

A nuisance property is defined as unlawful activity occurring on the rental property.

NUISANCE PROPERTY

A REMINDER THE FOLLOWING ARE <u>NOT</u> UNLAWFUL ACTIVITIES:

Contact made to the police or other emergency services, if: a) the contact was made with the intent to prevent or respond to domestic violence or sexual violence; b) the intervention of emergency assistance was needed to respond to or prevent domestic violence or sexual violence; or c) the contact was made by, on behalf of, or otherwise concerns an individual with a disability and the purpose of the contact was related to that individual's disability.

An incident or incidents of <u>actual or threatened domestic violence or sexual violence</u> against a tenant, household member, or guest occurring in the rental unit or on the leased premises


<u>Unlawful activity</u> occurring in the rental unit or on the leased premises that is <u>directly</u> relating to domestic violence or sexual violence, engaged by the tenant, member of a tenant's household, guest, or other party, and against a tenant, household member, guest or other party.


UNLAWFUL ACTIVITIES/NARCOTICS

In 2024, the DeKalb Police Department investigated and seized larger than normal amounts of narcotics from rental properties. The 2024 annual report/crime statistics are not completed at this time. However, over the last several years, the department has seen a significant increase in drug/narcotic/drug equipment violations throughout the City.











More than three ounces of Crack Cocaine seized from an apartment.

ILLEGAL DRUG ACTIVITY WARNING SIGNS

People visiting all hours of the day for brief periods

No visible means of support, yet tends to pay rent in cash

Fortified entry and interior doors

Pays rent months in advance

Drug equipment

– pipes, bongs,
syringes, small
baggies, etc.

Weight scales, large amounts of foil, baking soda, or other chemicals

WAYS TO COMBATILLEGAL ACTIVITY

Trespass Agreements with the DeKalb Police Department.

Hold tenants accountable to their lease provisions and the Crime Free Addendum.

Secure buildings.

Install proper lighting/motion lights.

Create clear site lines of the property (keep bushes and trees trimmed).

Install surveillance cameras.

Perform routine inspections.

Keep property clean of graffiti and trash.

Unlike other illegal activities, drug usage and sales are usually visible to those outside the home/residence. As landlords and neighbors, we need to stay engaged and address any and all illegal activity that arises. These crimes can have a big impact on the families involved and the neighborhoods in which they occur.



BE AN ENGAGED LANDLORD



Look for signs of illegal activities occurring on your properties. Reach out to the DeKalb Police Department or the Crime Free Housing Bureau for assistance.



PROJECT HOPE

If you have a tenant that you believe may have an addiction and needs assistance, you can reach out to the Police Department for help.

The Police Department has a program called PROJECT HOPE.

PROJECT HOPE (Heroin, Opioid Outreach Prevention and Education) has placed approximately 100 people into addiction treatment facilities.
