



Terms & Conditions

The tree planting application for (NAME)	, at
(ADDRESS)	, is approved contingent upor
compliance with the following terms and/or conditions	



- 1. The planting hole shall be prepared so that it is at least as deep as the root mass of the tree and at least 1 and $\frac{1}{2}$ times the root mass width.
- 2. The root collar of the tree shall be planted level with the surrounding ground.
- 3. The flared base of the trunk shall remain above ground level and the roots shall be completely covered with soil.
- 4. After planting is completed, the soil shall be watered thoroughly and then weekly whenever any dry spell occurs during the first spring, summer and fall seasons of the initial planting.
- 5. A tree planted below overhead utility lines shall have a minimum diameter of one inch (1") and shall meet "utility-tree" height and species requirements.
- 6. Mulch chips are free as they are available at the City of DeKalb's Landscape Waste collection site on Dresser Road, next to Fire Station #3.

Tree Planting Guidelines

Planting Trees on **Public** Property:

Prior to planting trees in the parkway or other public rights-of-way, it is important to consider the trees growing potential and how it will co-exist with the surrounding area as it relates to utility lines, snow removal operations, street cleaning, truck traffic and motorist visibility.

Please refer to the City of DeKalb's approved planting list within this brochure to assure you have selected an approved species. Be prepared to ensure the planting site is in the correct location, provides the necessary clearances (proximity to public, private and natural infrastructure) and you have submitted the required application for planting a tree.

Planting Trees on Private Property:

The City of DeKalb encourages citizens to plant trees to enhance the environment as well as the beautification and enjoyment of your home, neighborhood and city. The <u>right</u> tree planted in the <u>right</u> place will not only enhance the environment for many years, but may also increase your property value.

Special consideration must be planned for any tree that is to be planted to assure it is appropriate for its intended location. Weather conditions, species adaptability, easements, land use covenants, height, planting area and maintenance considerations require thoughtful planning to provide the best opportunity for the tree's survival.

Citizen Sponsored – Public Tree Planting Guidelines:

Citizens who wish to plant a tree on a public right-of-way (parkway) are required to fill out a tree planting application prior to planting. This application will be reviewed by the Public Works Department, if approved, it will be returned with a list of recommended trees for parkway plantings.

Trees planted where overhead utility lines do not exist require a minimum of 2" diameter and be a tree species selection from the City's pre-approved tree list is encouraged. Trees not listed on the pre-approved list will be reviewed on a "case by case" basis. Tree species are also subject to environmental conditions and optimal distances from other natural and or man made public and private infrastructure.

Trees planted where overhead utility lines do exist require a minimum of 1" diameter and a "utility" tree species selection from the City's pre-approved list. Trees not listed on the pre-approved list will be reviewed on a "case by case" basis.

Please call (815) 748-2030 or (815) 748-2040 to assure your tree planting plan is aligned with local terms and conditions to assure the long term potential of your tree planting selection and/or discuss alternative tree selections to take advantage of this program.
