

AUTHORIZING AN APPLICATION TO THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION'S 2016 TRANSPORTATION INVESTMENT GENERATING ECONOMIC RECOVERY (TIGER) DISCRETIONARY GRANT PROGRAM IN THE AMOUNT OF \$18,280,000 FOR THE FULL CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW TRANSIT FACILITY.

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Transportation's ("USDOT") TIGER Discretionary Grant Program ("TIGER") provides funding for capital investments in surface transportation infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, the City of DeKalb seeks to apply for grant funding to construct the DeKalb County Public Transportation Facility Project, which project will construct a new 83,000 square foot public transportation facility that will drastically improve the mobility and livability of those who use public transportation in the region.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DEKALB, ILLINOIS

Section 1. The foregoing Recitals shall be and are hereby incorporated in this Section 1 as if said Recitals were fully set forth.

Section 2. That the City seeks grant funding in the amount of Eighteen Million, Two-hundred and Eighty dollars (\$18,280,000) and pledges matching funds in the amount of Nine-hundred and Twenty Thousand dollars (\$920,000) in cash and in-kind services.

Section 3. That the Corporate Authorities hereby authorize the application for grant funding and authorize the Mayor and the City Clerk of the City of DeKalb, as well as any other City official or employee as may be required or convenient, to sign on behalf of the City of DeKalb the said Grant and any other document necessary or convenient to fulfill the intent of this Resolution.

Section 4. That the provisions of this Resolution are severable and if any court of competent jurisdiction shall declare any portion of this Resolution to be invalid or unenforceable, said decision shall not affect any portion of this Resolution, other than the part declared invalid or unenforceable. The City Council hereby declares that it would have enacted this Resolution even with the invalid or unenforceable portion deleted.


Section 5. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval in the manner provided by law.

Section 6. That this Resolution is expressly adopted pursuant to the Home Rule authority of the City of DeKalb under Section 6(a) of Article VII of the Illinois Constitution of 1970, and that all Resolutions or motions in conflict with this Resolution are repealed insofar as they conflict.

Section 7. That any resolution or motion in conflict with this Resolution is hereby repealed insofar as it conflicts with this Resolution.


RE: Federal Wage Rate Requirement Certification
