

ORDINANCE 2015-009 PASSED: JANUARY 26, 2015

**DIRECTING THE ACQUISITION OF CERTAIN
REAL PROPERTY IN THE CITY OF DEKALB.**

WHEREAS, the City of DeKalb, DeKalb County, Illinois is a home rule community with those powers granted under the provisions of the Illinois Constitution and the Illinois Municipal Code, 65 ILCS 5/1-1-1, *et. seq.*; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that the acquisition of certain real property as contemplated below is required to properly promote the public health, safety, welfare and morals; and,

THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of DeKalb, DeKalb County, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1. Property to be acquired.

The Mayor is authorized and directed to send a letter to the DeKalb County Treasurer and Trustee requesting the conveyance of parcels 08-27-279-027 and 08-27-279-029 from the County to the City of DeKalb, on terms and conditions acceptable to him, and the City Manager is authorized and directed to expend funds within budgetary constraints and spending authority, and to take all other steps necessary to acquire said property.

Section 2. All ordinances or portions thereof in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 3. Should any provision of this Ordinance be declared invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions will remain in full force and affect the same as if the invalid provision had not been a part of this Ordinance.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect after passage and publication pursuant to law. Publication date: January 27, 2015. Effective date: February 5, 2015.
